



GIS Map of site locations







This page is updated when the Fall Cleanup dates are announced.

The Fall Cleanup program is a joint effort between the City of Omaha and participating neighborhood/homeowner associations. The annual free event provides Omaha residents with the opportunity to recycle or dispose of large or bulky items that are not accepted through curbside waste or recycling services (such as old furniture, appliances, tires, and mattresses)

Fall Cleanup is open to all City of Omaha households. Residents do not have to be a member of a neighborhood/homeowner association to participate. Only residential/household items are accepted (commercial waste is prohibited). Residents must unload their own vehicles, no assistance will be provided.

🛱 Dates

The 2021 Fall Cleanup takes place on four consecutive Saturdays in October (10/2, 10/9, 10/16, 10/23). Each Saturday, multiple neighborhoods in a specific section of the city will accept items for disposal and recycling between 9:00 AM - 2:00 PM.



Arrive prior to 8am and staff volunteers through 3pm


Meet with truck driver & your recycling and reuse vendors (if previously arranged)

Meet the City Inspector to receive your safety cones, vests, and event packet

Accept items starting at 9:00 AM and cut off the line at 2:00 PM



Event goes on rain or shine. Make a plan for severe weather, such as a tornado or thunderstorm.




EVENT PACKET



ABOUT YARDWASTE



Unlimited curbside yard waste collection will occur October 28 to December 6.



Grass clippings, leaves, and small branches (under 2" in diameter) are accepted at 5225 Dayton St. during Omaha Cleanup Saturdays

ABOUT UNDERTHESINK

Open 9-2pm, no appointment necessary on Omaha **Cleanup Saturdays**





Do not accept items before 9:00am



Cut off the line at 2:00pm



Truck drivers are not contracted to help unload items. Residents are expected to unload their own materials.



At the end of the event: clean up debris, return safety cones and vests to the City Inspector, collect yard signs and keep for reuse, and complete the online survey the following Monday







VOLUNTEER ROLES

Greeters (1-2)

Greet cars, hand out brochures & directions to special collection sites

Traffic Control (2-3)

Line Managers (1-2)

Inform resdients of wait time, check for prohibited items

Extra Help (3-4)

Provide breaks, help with recycling efforts

VOLUNTEER SAFETY



Resdients are expected to unload their own materials



Set up a safe check-in site, equipped with water, shade, and chairs



Provide volunteers with a safety vest




ORGANIZE LITTER CLEANUP

RECYCLING & REUSE OPPORTUNITIES





Check out KOB's <u>Recycling & Reuse Guide</u> to see a list of vendors that have confirmed their willingness to work with you. Or, reach out to your own metal, electronic, plastic, or donation vendors.



Confirm date, time, and location with your vendors. They should arrive at 8am to set-up.



None of the organizations provided are officially endorsed by KOB or the City of Omaha. You have final authority on if items are donated to any vender on the day of your cleanup.



Please note:

- Appliance sites cannot host a metal recycler
- Vendors are not required, but encouraged
- It is the site's responsibility to reach out to vendors. The vendors listed on the Recycling & Reuse Guide understand their participation is by invitation or prior arrangement only.
- If you identify a good vender that should be added to the list next year, please provide KOB with their contact information.
